AP Stats Policies Mrs. Loucks

Course Description:

AP Statistics is designed to be equivalent to a one semester college level statistics course. There are four main topics you will be studying in this course: exploratory data analysis, planning a statistical study, probability as it relates to distributions of data, and inferential reasoning. Students are strongly encouraged to take the AP Statistics test in May.

Supplies:

The textbook we use for this course is <u>The Practice of Statistics, 4th edition</u> by Starnes, Yates, and Moore. Textbooks should be brought with you to class on a daily basis, but should always be available at home in case of absence. This course and the AP Statistics test are extremely calculator based. It is <u>STRONGLY</u> recommended that you purchase a TI-84 calculator for use in this course. You will also want to have paper and <u>PENCIL(S)</u> with you in class each day. You may organize your notes, assignments, worksheets, etc. in any manner that works for you.

Tests and Quizzes:

Students may not use electronic communication devices during a test or quiz. If the device is used, it will be considered cheating and the student will receive a 0 on the assessment. This includes ringing/vibrating regardless of whether or not the call/page/text was answered. Note to seniors: you will be exempt from the second semester exam if you have an overall semester average of B- or better.

Homework Policy:

There will be homework nearly every day (even on Friday⁽²⁾). It is very important that you keep up. A score will be recorded at the beginning of the hour for your daily homework assignments. You will earn three points if **<u>every</u>** problem is attempted. You must show all work and include context in your answers in order to receive full credit! You will earn one point if at least half the assignment is completed properly. You may turn in late assignments for 2 points **<u>before</u>** the test. Late assignments must be turned in <u>before</u> 7:20 am on the day of the test!! Remember that 2 out of 3 points is a D+. It is recommended that you keep all your work organized in a folder and/or notebook.

Cell Phone Policy:

Every student with a cell phone will be assigned a number. When you enter the classroom on test/quiz day, you must put your phone in your designated phone storage pouch. Once the bell rings all phones should be properly stored. Your phone must remain in phone storage until ALL students have completed the assessment or I say it is ok. Any other day, phones may only be used in a responsible, non-distracting manner. Photos, videos, or recordings of others without their permission is prohibited. You are responsible for your own device. Improper use of device will result in confiscation and disciplinary action. Phones should not be out <u>at</u> <u>all</u> during notes and classroom activities unless otherwise specified. Absolutely no headphones during notes, class discussions or test/quiz day (until EVERYONE completes their assessment).

Grading Policy:

Grades will be based primarily on assessments – quizzes and tests. There MAY be projects assigned throughout the year that will add to your total points each quarter. Homework will be counted for points but will not be a major portion of your semester grade. The semester grade will be determined by percentage using the two quarter grades (40% each) and the semester final exam (20%). Percentages are rounded to the <u>nearest</u> whole percent. I will adhere to the school grading scale.

Make-up Work:

All notes, warm-ups, homework, quizzes and tests must be made up promptly after an absence. It is the <u>responsibility of the student</u> to ask someone in class for this information (don't forget to refer to your assignment sheet). Remember that assignments are available on my web site at <u>www.mrsloucks.weebly.com</u>. If you are absent on the day of a quiz or test, <u>you</u> must make arrangements to take a makeup. <u>A student</u> <u>who misses one or both review days must still take the test as scheduled</u>. Students who have pre-arranged absences will not be given extra time to do make-up work. I highly recommend that you take vacations only during planned school breaks since it can be very difficult to stay caught up when you miss class. If you do choose to miss school for an extended time, please realize it is your responsibility to get the help you need! Tests and quizzes given the day before a school vacation must be taken before a student leaves.

A student who misses class for a school-related activity must complete the assignment for

the next day. If a test or quiz is scheduled for that day, it must be taken the day before or the morning of the trip. He/she will not be given extra days.

General Expectations:

1) Respect others.

- 2) Come to class prepared. If you need to borrow something, do it **before** class.
- 3) Remain in your seat during lectures and class discussions.
- 4) Do not interrupt lectures or discussions for personal requests.
- 5) Use common sense.
- 6) There will be no foul language or inconsiderate comments allowed!
- 7) Anything written in pen will receive **<u>NO</u>** credit.
- 8) Cheating will result in a zero grade. Cheating on a homework assignment will result in a zero grade for that chapter's homework score for <u>everyone</u> involved!
